ACCOMPLISHMENTS 2013

We celebrate the fifth annual report of FLD, thanking God for the change and growth we see within our community, through developed capacity and physical reach, by the people themselves and faithful partnerships of many friends. Please join in rejoicing with us as we share the stories below.

Newly built Maternity Clinic at Triloka



Ground was broken in January, the foundation built in February,

the walls went up in March and so it continued.

In December the young people from Nazareth in Adelaide together with the young people of Centro Treinamento Mekaniku da Paz in Triloka painted the building.





Here it stands the new maternity building, completed through the partnerships of many. This was FLD's big project for 2013!

In 2013 FLD ran its first training in mechanics and agriculture at *Centro Treinamentu Mekaniku da Paz*. We congratulate the first 10 graduates (see picture on front cover) who received their certificates in December 2013. The Chief of the village of Triloka, Senhora Maria do Carmo, presented the graduates with their certificates, stating how proud she was that 7 of them were young women. Participants came from villages from the four eastern districts of Timor-Leste.

In April FLD's three mechanic trainers graduated with a nationally accredited *Certificate level III in Training & Assessment*. This is another milestone in the development of the centre.

TRAINING CENTRE FOR VOCATIONAL MECHANICS AND PEACE BUILDING







TRILOKA HEALTH CLINIC & MOBILE CLINICS & MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH

Triloka community health services, including clinic and mobile clinics, as well as the maternal & child health programs, have continued strongly to serve Triloka and 12 surrounding villages. The clinic has become an integral part, where advice is sought and new things are learned. It also offers an opportunity for young local volunteers to learn and practice nursing, administration and educational skills.

RECEIVING MEDICINES FROM DIFAEM

FLD received a shipment of medicines from DIFAEM for Triloka community clinic in April. Clinic staff sorting, unpacking, checking the lists and sorting the medicines into the storage room.



HEALTH EDUCATION



The importance of hand-washing and using soap continues to be a focus topic of the Health Education program. Other modules were held about: How to prevent worms, Human body, Nutrition as good health prevention & Personal Hygine. Not only are illnesses explained but especially how to prevent them. These topics are held in the clinic waiting room, during mobile clinics in the villages, in five primary schools, one junior high school, a kindergarten, and two vocational training centres.

MOTHERS SUPPORT GROUP

The weekly *Nutrition Cooking Demonstration* program has been running strong all year with an average attendance of 87/month. Out of this the idea was born to begin a monthly *mother's support group*, which FLD started in November. Here mothers are given space and the opportunity to discuss issues of health they face in their families and seek medical advice and find solutions to problems together.



AGRICULTURE WORK

In 2013 FLD partnered with farmers in Uatulari Viqueque in planting and harvesting a rice-field. The crops were shared equally, and FLD's part is the rice for the training centre and clinic lunches. The agricultural work also focused on horticulture, such as vegetables and tomatoes and a large field of corn. This work involves 125 farming families.

SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT

FLD continued to support the twenty-five families from *Home* village with their weaving work, assisting with connecting them to markets, as their village is very remote (the amount of income in 2013 channelled through FLD to the *Home* weavers totalled





The women's group in Bucoli village put the sewing machines donated to good use as they scored a contract with the local schools to sew the school uniforms. This has created a stable source of income for this group of women.

UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

This year FLD was able to offer two new scholarships in the medical field to two promising rural young people, offering a rare opportunity for higher education. Upon completion they will return to work at the FLD Triloka clinic and give back to their community. The current total of four students in the scholarship program are:



Cesario Pereira Freitas completed his 2nd & 3rd semester towards a three-year Bachelor degree in Pharmacy at Akademi Pharmacy Putra Indonesia, in Malang, Indonesia. He comes from the Mountain village of Lakulihu-Sarbaikili.



Ana Josefa Ximenes began her first semester 2013 September, towards three-year Bachelors degree midwifery at STIKES Widyagama Husada University Malang, Indonesia. She comes Mountain from the village of Afaloikai.

Anastasia Maria Guterres completed her 4th & 5th semester successfully towards a Bachelor in Midwifery at STIKES Widyagama Husada University in Malang, Indonesia. She hopes to complete her studies and return in March 2014.



Paulo Fransico Simoes began his first semester September, towards a three-year Bachelors degree nursing at Sekolah Tinggi Kesehatan STIKES Kendedes University Malang, Indonesia. He comes from the Mountain village of Alawa.
