Dear Friends and Supporters,

We are writing having recently received some very good news for our small clinic and the community of Triloka. In late August we received word from the Health Ministry of the Government of Timor-Leste that our clinic had passed accreditation. The process is a first for the Democratic Republic of Timor-Leste as it seeks to implement standards and uphold basic health care across the country. It is certainly also a milestone for us and we would like to celebrate this achievement with you and let you know a few others things that have been happening over the last few months.

Community Hall

The long awaited renovation of the Triloka Community Hall began in early May with

community members strengthening the foundations and reinforcing the existing structure. Heads of the village agreed that all 4 sub village would be involved through rotating shifts, lead by a core community work group, comprised of Triloka's local builders.

The arrival of the Kalamanda work crew saw the beginning of a very busy week of hard labour and skill sharing between the technically savy Kalamunda mob and the practical, innovative members of the Triloka community. Through the great fundraising efforts of





the Kalamunda group, we were able to purchase high grade materials from Norm Bruce at Timor Roofing in Baucau, providing the Triloka Community Hall with a brand new, Australian steel roof. A special thanks goes to young Alex, a returned member of the Kalamunda Schoolies Group, whose expertise in roofing came in very handy. Also the beautiful meals cooked by a group of local women and shared by all, contributed to the strong community spirit which embodied this great activity.

The entire project was completed in just under a month and has resulted in a total revival of the community hall which is now a grand looking structure the whole community is very proud of indeed. New Tais Product for Timor

Part of Fundasaun Lafaek Diak's (FLD) work in supporting small business development involves assisting a women's weaving cooperative in Home, Los Palos. Since 2007, the Terrace Timor Network (TTN), a group of parents, staff and students of St Joseph's College Gregory Terrace in Brisbane, Australia, has assisted the co-operative through ongoing purchases of traditional hand woven Tais pieces. These include a range of vibrant tableware, bookmarks and most recently, the creation of the "Bro-Band". The Bro-Band (short for



Brotherhood Band) is a tais wrist band that is worn to show solidarity with the Timorese people's struggle for justice and independence. The product design and development took 15 months of sampling and trials, which allowed the product to be adapted to suit the local market in Brisbane. During this process many valuable lessons in production, design and quality control were learned, - all of which are key factors for the successful and sustainable marketing and sale of these products in Brisbane and elsewhere. Through

TTN's network several thousand wrist bands have been ordered and delivered. Schools in Brisbane have used them for large events as the 'ticket' at the door to prove one has paid the entrance fee. Sales of these products directly benefit the Home (Lospalos) community, both as a valuable new source of income and as an opportunity to further develop their skills.

The total sales FLD assisted with in 2008 for the women's weaving network totaled USD\$3,713.75. Special thanks to all who were part of these efforts!





Agriculture

FLD is slowly but steadily developing an ongoing agricultural support program with the farming community of Triloka. In March, staff, together with the community and students from the Canossian Training College (CTID) in Baucau joined our farmers group to harvest peanuts in nearby fields.

FLD is helping to secure seed supply in the community through the purchase of large plastic drums for safe storage. For many farmers in East Timor, seed saving is a difficult process, with many seeds lost to pests and families forced to sell in the hungry season for small amounts of money. The many hands made for light work with singing, laughing and a large feast with the community over lunch. No task was too small, with two Sisters from the College setting the peanut picking pace and keeping the spirits high.

A brand new electronic catalog is now available displaying the entire range of wonderful products produced locally by The Rural Women's Craft Network in Baucau. FLD supports the network through a commitment to buying products such as hand-made natural medicinal soap and *Guri Guri Gizi* nutrition formula made locally at the CTID college. By supporting local

Black Stone



On the 28th-29th of April, FLD in collaboration with CTID, ran two days of training in the production of *Black Stone*. Black stone is a piece of buffalo thigh bone specially treated so that it can extract venom when applied to a snake bite, as well as other venomous bites. Originally developed in Africa, the patent for this indigenous knowledge is now owned by a German organisation who works towards widening its availability throughout the world. Snake and scorpion bites are common in East Timor and the Triloka Clinic

has been using Black Stones to treat venomous bites with great success for over two years. There were a total of 21 participants who attended the training, including all Triloka Clinic staff, representatives from the 4 sub-villages of Triloka, as well as 4 participants from the neighbouring villages of Ostico and Bucoli. The enthusiastic participants received a certificate on completion of the training, as well as a black stone kit and, most importantly, the knowledge to use and produce this useful treatment in their own communities.



We are one world, one voice, one heart beating.....



On 22 August, the Melbourne Community Choir 'Thursday's Children' visited Triloka and gave a concert in the newly renovated village hall. Beautiful harmonies spread into the community as the Triloka primary school children gathered in interest. Then was again an exchange of skills, this time in the form of songs we shared as the Triloka kids taught the Australians a traditional children's song- 'Mai fali e, fila fali e, mama bolu ita fali e....' and the Melbourne choir taught the Triloka children- 'We are one world, one voice, one

heart beating.....' a song one of their members had written. The exchange reminded us of the human bond shared and of the power music has to reach across boundaries.

Solar Power for Triloka

As many of you will know, Triloka Village is without mains power and our clinic runs from a basic solar power system and diesel generator. With the expansion of our new clinic building we are hoping to move away from reliance of the dirty, expensive and unreliable diesel generator. In partnership with the Alternative Technology Association, FLD is seeking funding to develop a system that will provide enough energy over 11 months of the year to allow the clinic and organisation to run lighting, sterilizer, vaccination fridge, computers and printing equipment. Training will be provided to two community representatives to maintain and record energy use to monitor and make best use of the system over the years.

We are seeking partial or complete donations to complete the project.

- USD \$12,100 would pay for all the solar panels for the project
- USD \$6,700 would pay for the battery bank for the clinic
- USD \$2,900 would pay for the inverter for the clinic
