ACCOMPLISHMENTS 2017

Fundasaun Lafaek Diak (**FLD** – the Good Crocodile Foundation) looks back at a year filled with highlights which we wish to share with you in this report. Several of our goals for 2017 were made possible through many friends and supporters from around the world in collaboration with local community initiatives. People are engaged in improving their lives. For this fulfilling work and these rich partnerships we give thanks to God!

TRILOKA HEALTH CLINIC - MOBILE CLINICS - MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH – HEALTH EDUCATION







Health education continues to be a central component of FLD's work, beginning with little children, as prevention is important to their health. Emergency treatment of a small patient with asthma nebulizer. In this case it saved a life, before offering treatment for the illness.

Birthing preparation class doing gymnastics. Once a month a "mother's support" group also meets to empower women and offer peer-learning.







FLD's mobile clinic program expanded in 2017 by four additional remote villages, raising the number from 11 to 15.

Visiting doctors and other volunteers continue to join and work alongside the FLD's team and offer expertise and experience.

Completion of Medical Laboratory Building & Renovation of Doctor's Accomodation



The year began with the completion of building the medical laboratory (left) supported by the *Evang*. *Landeskirche Wuerttemberg*, *and* ended with the renovation of the doctor's accommodation in Triloka (right) made possible through a grant from the German Embassy in Jakarta, Indonesia.



Capacity Building – Staff Development



In February Dr. Mary Nelson led a workshop on Asset Based Community Development (ABCD) with the sub-villages chiefs of Triloka and surrounding villages together with the FLD staff.



Dr. Evangelino, the Head Surgeon at the Baucau Referral Hospital, has taken an active role in treatment at the Triloka community clinic. During 2017, he also offered a series of in-house medical trainings to the FLD staff.



FLD staff members attended an external seminar on leadership and management in Dili together with other Timorese NGOs.



Clinical psychologist from *Australia*, *Joy Eichhorn*, delivered a series of workshops to FLD staff on communication and personal skills.

Campaign to Combat Scabies at Community Level





In 2017 Timor Leste experienced a wide-scale scabies epidemic at the national level. *Kathleen Malcher* an experienced Australian registered nurse and medical student, volunteering at FLD for 5 months, in consultation with international specialists, initiated and FLD organised a campaign to combat scabies in October, 2017 at community level in Triloka village. The FLD medical team continued to treat *Scabies* patients regularly on its mobile clinic visits to remote villages. Treatment of scabies is fairly easy (though not inexpensive), but the danger of re-infection is very high.

Mobile Clinic Visit to Ossoluga





The old mobile clinic vehicle broke down on the way to a regular visit to the very remote village of *Ossoluga*. The FLD staff carried the medicines and patient cards up the steep hill and began with the consultations, while a group of villagers pulled the 4WD vehicle to the top It was then repaired before the FLD team could return to Triloka.

Building Triloka's 1st Playground







In July 2017 in partnership with the *Nazareth Outreach Work* volunteers from *Adelaide, Australia*, *Cornelius Balle* a young German volunteer from *St. Bonifatius* Parish in *Renningen, Germany*, FLD built a community playground at the *Aubaca (Triloka)* elementary school. The children are delighted with the playground and it gives them constructive recreational activities, and contributes to their physical, mental health and well-being. This is the first time the children have had a slide, a monkey bar and a seesaw.

University Scholarship Program

Two students remain in the FLD scholarship program during 2017.



SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT – The Weavers in *Home* Village






2017 was a very successful year for the 25 weavers families in Home village, due to a large order of over 6,000 friendship bands of the Triumph schools concert in Geelong, Australia. FLD's functions as the connector between the weavers in this remote village and the market. The weavers are dreaming of having their own weaving centre, where they can meet, to discuss, share ideas, learn and teach new weaving patterns and techniques and hold sales for visiting groups.

Agriculture Work



The agricultural training centre continued to operate, with a focus on raising chicken and growing corn, as well as vegetable gardening. FLD's approach is to work alongside the local community.
